



Ford Library receives Seneca Meadows grant

Mark Benjamin recently presented the Ford Library with a \$1,000 grant from Seneca Meadows to fund the library's Comic Creation Camp 2015. According to Library Director Shannon O'Connor, "Comic Camp is a perennial favorite at the Ford Library. This is our seventh year hosting this fantastic week-long class and we will have students returning who have participated all seven years." Students work with a professional comic writer/illustrator team to transform ideas into an originally written and illustrated comic. Student work is published in a comic anthology and added to the library collection. Comic Creation Camp is open to participants ages 8 and over and runs Aug. 3-7 from 10 a.m.-2 p.m. Participants bring a bag lunch. Registration is required and only a few spaces remain open for the camp. There is a class fee of \$25; library sponsored scholarships are available.
