helped above and beyond what I expected."

Habitat President Menzo Case said work to rehab the Miller Street property will begin immediately. Work also will continue on the current Habitat build at 2 Jay Street, Seneca Falls as well. Ferrara said many volunteers will be needed from now on as

sheetrock is installed and the interior walls are prepared and painted.

**PEOPLE DON'T NEED** to call in advance, but can just show up at the site, said Karen Simon, Habitat board member. Work will be on Saturday from 7:45 a.m.-3:30 p.m. and on Tuesday and Thursday from 4-7 p.m.

need to build homes or renovate existing homes to create decent, affordable housing. The houses then are sold to those in need at no profit and with no interest charged. Mortgage payments received by the affiliate are used to build more homes.

22 beautiful stained glass memorial windows are of opalescent glass, designed and manufactured by Booth Art Stained Glass Works, Buffalo. They were installed between 1903-05 during the pastorate of Rev. Hoyt Hill.

The tracker organ, purchased from St. John's Episcopal Church was installed in Rev. Owen's pastorate, 1905-12, at the same time as the new, soaring, wooden Gothic ceiling was built to save on heat costs. The original ceiling is made of tin and remains underneath the new ceiling.

THE LODI HISTORICAL Society took over the building about 1973 as it was about to be razed. It is now used for meetings, concerts, weddings, historical programs as well as rental space.

Admission to the recital is free with a reception to meet the artist after the performance. The building is handicapped accessible and street parking available. All are welcomed with a special invitation to the Organ Historical Society's members at the 59th annual convention in Syracuse, Aug. 11-14.
