1st draft of Yates budget: lower taxes

PENN YAN — The first draft of Yates County's 2016 budget calls for something residents have not seen in a while: A reduction in the tax rate.

While the tax levy would increase 1.4 percent, the rate would drop because of a 4.2 percent increase in the value of the county's taxable property. Treasurer and Budget Officer Nonie Flynn said in her budget memo to the Legislature. The new rate would be \$6.72 per \$1,000 of assessed property value, down 2.6 percent from this year's \$6.90.

The Legislature will hold workshops next week to review the spending plan, so the numbers could change. As currently drafted, however, the budget totals \$41.427 million, a 3.1 percent decrease from this year.

The tax levy would increase by \$221,146, to \$16,031 million. That's \$1,966 less than the 1.41 percent increase that Yates County would be allowed under this year's tax cap.

"The guideline that I received from the Legislature was to stay within the property tax cap, so I did that — by a very small margin," Flynn said Wednesday. The budget shows a decrease in

the cost of Social Services, primarily due to a decrease in the projected number of children in foster care. It includes the 3 percent raises called for in union contracts.

The county would use \$1.434 million in reserve funds to balance the budget, a \$773,616 decrease from last year.

This is the first budget Flynn has prepared for the county. County Administrator Sarah Purdy stepped down as budget officer in August.

Legislators received the budget information after their meeting Monday. They will meet at 9 a.m. Oct. 26 and 27 for the workshop sessions.

Grant helps Wayne Catholic Charities

Agency lands \$1.6 million in federal funding, will start Thriving Family Program to strengthen relationships

NEWARK — With \$1.6 million in federal funding secured and more in the offing, Catholic Charities of Wayne County will establish a new program to help local families navigate all aspects of life.

"We are really excited," said

U.S. Sens. Charles Schumer and Kirsten Gillibrand and Rep. John Katko, R-24 of Camillus, announced the \$1.658 million allocation from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services this week.

They said the money will help deliver critical services.

The Thriving Family Program is expected to reach more than 1,500 youths and adults each year. Catholic Charities will collaborate with Family Counseling Services of the Finger Lakes, Literacy Volunteers, the Victim Resource Center, the Wayne County Action Program and the Ad Council to offer them family education, case management and assessment services.

The goals include improved family function, improved adult and child well-being, increased economic stability, reduced poverty and reduced recidivism.
